### **Joint Strategy for East London's Resources and Waste – Consultation**

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the above consultation document. As the Government's adviser on the historic environment, Historic England is keen to ensure that the conservation and enhancement of the historic environment is taken fully into account at all stages and levels of the Local Plan process.

Our comments are made in the context of the principles relating to the historic environment and local plans within the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) and the accompanying Planning Practice Guide (PPG).

We note the focus of the Strategy on managing and reducing future levels of waste in East London and as such our comments are limited. We would simply stress in relation to future infrastructure needs the requirement to appropriately consider any impacts on the historic environment. The NPPF is clear that any harm to significance of heritage assets should require clear and convincing justification and it is important that all planning documents with potential to affect the historic environment properly reflect this approach.

I trust these comments are helpful.
